What was the best aspect of this event?

For me it was really important to hear about other scientists' and doctors' experiences, what are the main points in planning and doing the scientific research.

The possibility of sharing knowledge and ideas with other researchers. To have had plenty of time to talk and discuss with the other researchers.

I really like the atmosphere created by the organizers. It was friendly, down to earth and emphasizing specific questions and state of art of the tissue engineering field in the genitourinary system. We basic researcher meet clinicians who spoke on specific needs required for genitourinary tissue disease such as vaginal prolapse and urethra strictures, and got the possibility of taking the first step for future collaboration.

the unmet needs in urogenital tissue engineering, shaped by both clinical and patient perspectives, span functional voiding to aesthetic and psychological impacts, all while navigating a complex regulatory landscape. Recognizing and integrating these factors into clinical practice is essential for delivering holistic, patient-centered urological care in the future. We need to further contact the patients involved, only by consulting the most important stakeholder in the questions and developments in our field, we can move forward. Female patients with pelvic problems are already united in the WFIPP, we are currently moving towards involving male patients with urethral diseases by contacting them on social media platforms as Reddit and Facebook.
